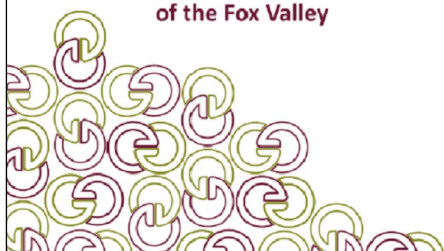

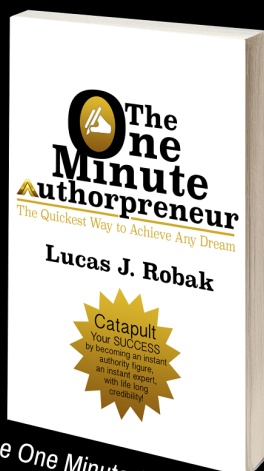

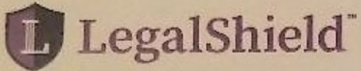

Before a word is ever spoken, your body has made a first impression. Every speaker is encouraged to develop a “confident and effective” stance, yet the process of HOW to master this fundamental element has traditionally relied on memorized postures or artificial ‘poses’. This workshop identifies the distinct components that create and influence stance. Participants are encouraged to recognize the basic elements of stance, identify common patterns, and learn how to describe them. Most importantly, participants are taught specific exercises to build their confidence, coordination, and ultimately, their credibility through their stance...also called ‘presence’.

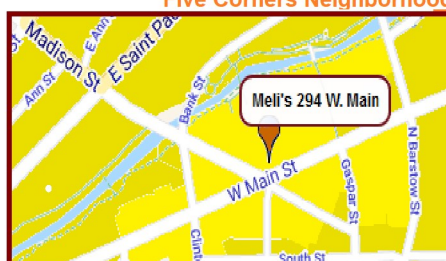
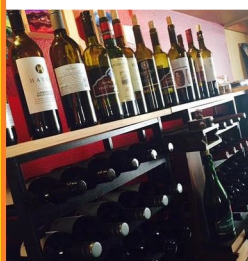

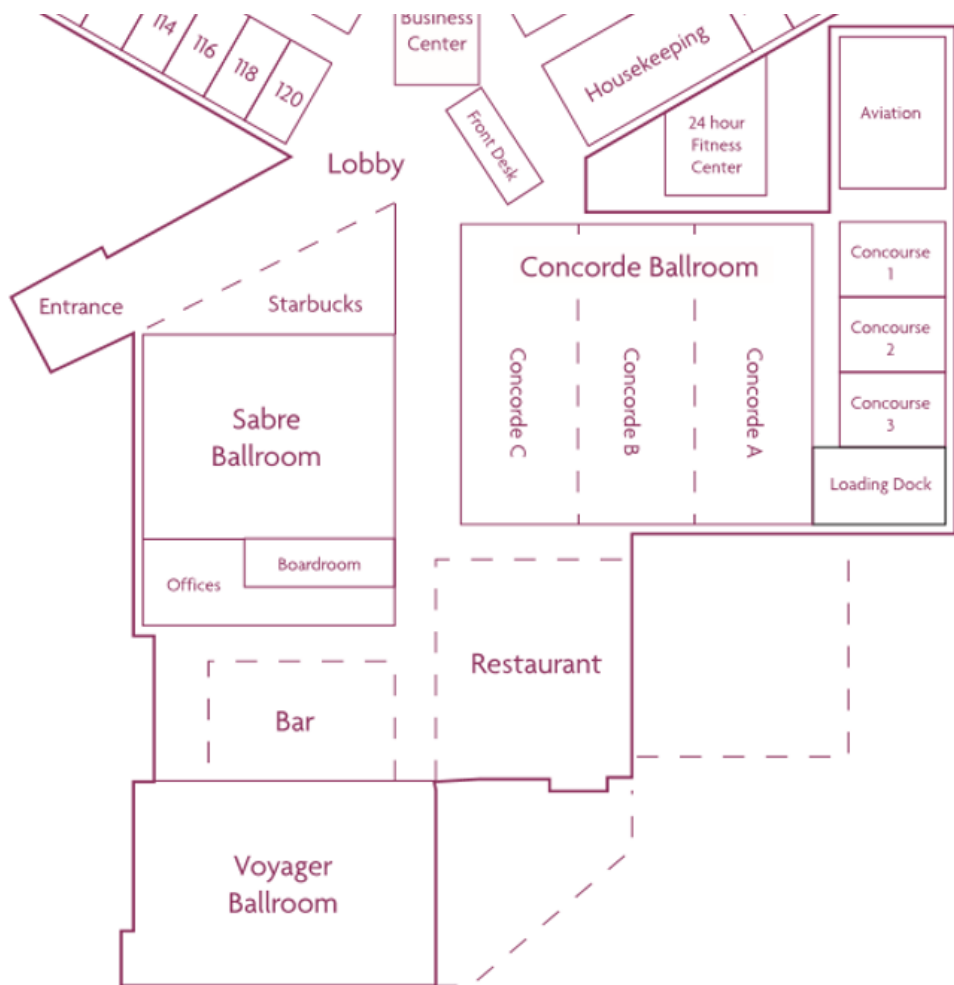
